



NCC Verified Components and Accessories Schemes

What is the NCC Product Verification Scheme?

It is the collective name for the two registers of verified products:

NCC Verified Components Scheme

The NCC Verified Components Scheme is a register of industry related products that go into making a finished tourer, motorhome, holiday home and park home e.g. hobs, heating/ventilation etc. The register is intended for use by NCC members and is therefore only accessible from the NCC members' area of our website.

NCC Verified Accessories Scheme

The NCC verified Accessories Scheme is a register of industry related products that are not a fixture or fitting in a tourer, motorhome, holiday home and park home e.g. fire extinguishers, wax/polishes, fire blankets.

How does a product get verified?

The manufacturer shall provide a completed application form detailing each product to be verified by the NCC. The NCC will also require the manufacturer's own Declaration of Conformity (DOC) for each product which should list all the relevant design and build standards that the product complies with. The DOC should be supported by relevant test reports and/or certificates obtained from recognised (ISO 17025 or equivalent) test laboratories. Products are then verified based on a thorough review of the third-party test reports and/or certificates against the standards listed on the DOC and other sources.

In the event that an innovative product is presented for verification for which there are no applicable national (BS), European (EN) or international (ISO) test standards for it to be assessed against the NCC will ask the applicant for verifiable, objective evidence from a suitable test laboratory (certified for testing of similar technologies to ISO 17025 or equivalent) that the product is both safe and fit for purpose. The NCC may require additional testing to be carried out at the applicant's expense before a product is verified.

If the product is successfully verified it will be issued with a certificate, valid for one year, and granted the usage rights of the NCC Verified Badge, under strict terms and conditions. The product will be included on the Verified Components/Accessories register and listed on the NCC's website. (www.thencc.org.uk)

Who can submit products for verification?

The Product Verification Scheme is open to both NCC members and non-members. NCC members can submit an unlimited number of products for verification FREE OF CHARGE. Non-members can submit a limited number of products, 15 in total, for an annual fee of £500.

How long does verification take?

Upon receipt of the relevant certificates/reports, drawings, images and any other information required, the verification process can take anything from a few hours to a few days, depending upon the number and complexity of products submitted.

How long does verification last?

Verification lasts for as long as the product approval remains valid or until a registered product becomes unavailable or is withdrawn – e.g. as part of a recall etc.

Every 12 months the NCC will provide each company a copy of their current entry/entries on the register providing an opportunity to review the current listing and make any adjustments.

Who at the NCC should members contact if they want to have a product verified?

How do you find out if a particular product is verified?

The 'Verified Components Register' is intended for use by NCC manufacturer members and is therefore only accessible from the members' area of the website.

The 'Verified Accessories Register' is intended to provide consumers with guidance on accessory and 'add-on' items and is therefore available on the public facing side of the website (www.thenc.org.uk).

What happens if a product does not meet the criteria?

There will inevitably be products that don't meet the criteria of the scheme resulting in the NCC being unable to complete the verification. In this event the NCC will endeavour to notify the applicant as soon as possible and advise a suitable course of action should they wish to pursue their application.
